 - cover scenes in all parts of the Borough

Springy's hints and tips for a fabulous photo



- We get lots and lots of Winter photographs. If you submit photographs depicting Summer, Autumn and Spring you will have a better chance of winning.
- Many good photographs are spoilt by the scene not being properly framed – often we see good shots spoilt by distracting items in the background such as passing vehicles, advertisement signs, inquisitive people and the like!
- Photographs showing local events in recognisable locations seem to attract the judging panel's eye. Events are popular with the Judging Panel. Think of sporting events of all kinds, seasonal and religious festivals, civic ceremonies, and entertainments.
- We get lots of photographs of very familiar locations i.e. the Town Hall and Hollingworth Lake: so take a less obvious approach to familiar places.
- Photographs with the date and time printed over the image seem to be discounted by the Judging Panel.
- Make sure your photograph primarily illustrates a great recognisable location. Photographs simply showing, for example, animals in an anonymous field don't seem to be selected.
